

Race and Criminal Justice in Monroe County, Indiana - January 2020 Update

1. Summary

Based on analysis of Monroe County criminal cases filed between January 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019, Blacks were defendants in 16.3% of all cases and in 21.2% of the cases where the most serious charge was Misdemeanor Possession of Marijuana. Race was not reported in 1.4% of the criminal cases filed.

For context, the U.S. Census race and ethnicity demographics show “Black Alone” as 3.6% of the Monroe County population in 2018.

Blacks were defendants in 16.0% of the cases with defendants from Monroe County. Some defendants were involved in more than one case. As a percentage of defendants (as opposed to cases), Blacks made up 14.6% of the defendants from Monroe County and 16.0% of all defendants.

2. Background / Monroe County Court Data Request

“Race and Criminal Justice in Monroe County, Indiana: A Long-Range Perspective” (See <http://UUbloomington.org/race-and-criminal-justice>) was published in 2018 by the Monroe County Branch of the NAACP and the Racial Justice Task Force, Unitarian Universalist Church of Bloomington. Per that report, Blacks were far more likely to be incarcerated than would be expected by their population as Monroe County residents in each of the five years studied since 1997. In order to gain insights into possible sources of the disparity, the report recommended “The Monroe County Criminal Justice System, particularly the courts and prosecutor, should publish detailed data in a format that can be easily analyzed by the public.”

Subsequent to the report, it was learned that Monroe County court records are no longer kept locally, but rather are maintained in the state’s data and court management system, known as Odyssey. In August of 2019, Guy Loftman submitted a bulk data request to the Indiana Office of Court Services on behalf of the Monroe County Branch of the NAACP, formally signed by Branch President William Vance. The request was for non-confidential data related to criminal cases filed in Monroe County from January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. The cost to obtain the data was shared by the Monroe County Branch of the NAACP and the Racial Justice Task Force of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Bloomington.

The bulk data files were generated on October 1, 2019 and received on November 6, 2019 by Guy Loftman and Ruth Aydt. This January 2020 update focuses on an initial analysis of files related to criminal cases and the defendants associated with those cases.

3. Case and Defendant Data

There were 11646 charges filed in 7259 cases during the 18 months represented in the data. 4428 of the cases involved a single charge.

Note: While the filed date for the cases was between January 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019, 350 of the cases had offense dates prior to January 1, 2018.

There were 16142 parties associated with the cases. Of those, 7219 represented individual defendants; other parties included state plaintiff, probation department, bond companies, etc.

Of the 11646 charges and 7259 cases in the Case Data, 11620 charges and 7230 cases had defendants listed.

4. Most Serious Charge

The charge entered as Filed Charge Number = 1 was presumed to be the most serious charge.

[Data Cleaning Note: Three cases had two records with Filed Charge Number = 1. Upon inspection, all three cases had been decided and involved pleas and dismissed charges. For these cases, both charge records were left in the data, hence the 7233 charges with Filed Charge Number = 1, larger than the total number of cases listed earlier.]

“Infraction Class C” includes charges such as no valid driving license and speeding.

“No State Code” includes actions such as of probation, extraditions, property maintenance violations, animals without rabies vaccinations, fee referrals, etc.

Removing the 481 cases where the most serious charge had a Filed Degree of “No State Code”, there are 6752 cases with charges of Murder, Felony, Misdemeanor, or Infraction Class C. Bloomington Police Department was involved with 45.38% of these cases, Monroe County Sheriff’s Office with 20.20% and Indiana University Bloomington Police with 15.42%.

5. Demographics for Cases

“All Cases” in these tables means all cases for which there was defendant data available, and for which the Filed Degree of the Filed Charge Number = 1 was something other than “No State Code”.

6. Residence of Defendant

For the 6752 cases included as “All Cases” in the previous section, there were 393 different city entries. These included “NA” (545 cases), <blank> (3 cases), and a few misspelled city names. Note: cities with the same name from different states are counted as a single city in this tally.

The 66 cities with 5 or more cases make up 6281 of the cases, 93.02% of the total. Of these, Bloomington accounted for 60.63%, “NA” for 8.07%, and Indianapolis for 5.55%. Based on an online source there are 15 zip codes in Monroe County. Defendants with Monroe County zip codes accounted for 4276 cases, 63.33% of the total.

8. Number of Cases per Defendant

In the Defendant Data, an individual is identified by a unique “PartyID”. In the Case Data, if multiple cases involve the same defendant those cases will have the same “PartyID”.

Over 41% of the cases are associated with defendants who had more than one case filed during the 18 month period.

11. Cases with Misdemeanor Possession of Marijuana as Most Serious Offense

There are 485 cases where the most serious offense is Misdemeanor Possession of Marijuana.

Note: 21 of these cases had offense dates prior to 2018.

Indiana University Bloomington Police were the arresting agency in over 45% of the cases.
